How do I Join?

In order to become a member of the Explorer Post, you must:

1. Submit an application for membership.
2. Attend 4 consecutive meetings.
3. Complete an oral interview with Advisory Staff.

Requirements

1. Must be between the ages of 13-21.
2. Must be enrolled in school, a high school graduate or have a GED.
3. Must be in good academic standing (C average minimum).
4. You can not have a "felony" arrest record.
5. Background checks are done on applicants eighteen and older.

Who are the Advisory Staff?

The Advisors are Police Officers, volunteers and employees from the Chattanooga Police Department. Advisor training is provided by the Boy Scouts of America.
