CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Chip Henderson called the business meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. A quorum was present that also included Vice Chair Jenny Hill, and Councilpersons Ken Smith, Darrin Ledford, Isiah Hester, Marvene Noel, and Demetrus Coonrod. Councilwoman Raquetta Dotley arrived shortly after the call to order.

 - DOT Grant match for automated test track (Smith & Ledford)
 - Rape Crisis Center co-location (Hill & Smith)
- The Council requested additional information regarding the strategic transfer of excess reserves to the Fire & Police Pension Fund; Mr. Hopkins responded [view <u>here</u>].
- At the conclusion of the presentation, Council had questions, comments, and requests regarding the following [view <u>here</u>]:
