CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairwoman Jenny Hill called the business meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. A quorum was present that also included Vice Chair Marvene Noel, and Councilpersons Cody Harvey, Dennis Clark, Raquetta Dotley, and Ron Elliott. Councilpersons Chip Henderson, Jeff Davis, and Jenni Berz were not in attendance of this meeting.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Councilman Clark, Committee Chair, called the Community Development Committee to order at 3:43 p.m., with a quorum of six councilpersons present. Councilpersons Henderson, Davis, and Berz were not in attendance of this meeting.

<u>MINUTE APPROVAL</u>: On motion of Councilman Elliott and seconded by Vice Chair Noel, the minutes of the last Community Development Committee meeting (June 10, 2025) were approved as published.

Presentation:

Councilman Clark touched on the recent changes to Tennessee state law which necessitated restructuring the Community Development Department, before introducing Mr. Henson, who is the current acting Interim Administrator for said Department. Mr. Henson then gave a brief presentation introducing himself & the Department, as well as how he plans to approach his first 90 days in office. - His intent to honor & further the Department's mission
- Phase I Learning: information gathering & assessing
- Phase II Shaping: alignment & team building
- Phase III Guiding: standardizing Community Center S.O.P.'s & streamlining communication

Afterwards, Councilman Clark asked Mr. Wilson to come forward and address the Council about the anticipated hiring process [for new Department head(s)]. AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 38, ZONING ORDINANCE, SO AS TO REZONE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 1614 EAST 17TH STREET, FROM RN-2 RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD ZONE TO TRN-2 TRANSITIONAL RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD ZONE, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

Councilwoman Noel moved to amend with two conditions: only 2 stories in height and 10 units total. Councilwoman Dotley seconded. The Applicant, Mark Richmond, was present in the Assembly and confirmed accepting these conditions. The motion carried. Attorney Noblett advised that the two conditions were not a part of the original ordinance, so the original ordinance would need to be put on the floor first, then amended. Therefore, Chairwoman Hill ruled to strike the previous motion, withdrawing it from the floor.

Councilman Elliott moved to approve the original motion. Councilman Harvey seconded. Vice Chair Noel **moved to amend** by adding two conditions: *only 2 stories in height* and *10 units total*. Councilman Clark seconded. The motion carried. **Vice Chair Noel moved** to approve as amended. Councilman Harvey seconded. The motion carried.
