CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairwoman Jenny Hill called the business meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. A quorum was present that also included Vice Chair Marvene Noel and Councilpersons Chip Henderson, Jeff Davis, Cody Harvey, Dennis Clark, Raquetta Dotley, and Ron Elliott. Councilwoman Jenni Berz was not present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairwoman Hill led the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance and gave an invocation. During the invocation, a prayer was offered for Councilwoman Berz and her family, who are currently grieving the loss of a loved one.

Councilman Elliott expressed disapproval of relinquishing zoning authority from the Council via this resolution. Ms. Miles (Economic Development) addressed the Council, outlining the process and its application according to state law and by-right process. Chairwoman Hill posed clarifying questions and gave her perspective of her experience with the program. Councilman Henderson inquired about amendment timelines. Councilman Clark asked clarifying questions about provisions. Councilman Elliott requested deferring the item for one week to July 15, 2025. Further discussion ensued with Ms. Miles. After all comments and questions, the issue was closed.
