CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Chip Henderson called the business meeting to order at 3:30 p.m. A quorum was present that also included Councilpersons Ken Smith, Darrin Ledford, Isiah Hester, Carol Berz, Raquetta Dotley, Marvene Noel, and Demetrus Coonrod. Council Vice Chair Jenny Hill was not in attendance of this meeting.

RESOLUTIONS

Agenda Item IX(b) – Economic Development (Relative to University of Chattanooga use of indoor softball facility)

Councilman Smith asked for clarification of this item. He wanted to know if the dates were correct, or if they were an extension. Mr. Beeland addressed the council and stated that he would confirm the dates and reach out to the council about the dates. Upon no further questions or comments, the issue was closed.

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Councilman Hester, Committee Chair, called the Parks & Public Works Committee to order at 3:43 p.m., with a quorum of eight present. Vice Chair Hill was not in attendance of this meeting.

<u>MINUTE APPROVAL</u>: On motion of Councilman Smith and second by Councilwoman Dotley, the minutes of the last Public Safety Committee meeting (October 15, 2024) were approved as published.

Councilman Hester instructed the clerk to read the final ordinance and resolutions on the committee agenda. Upon no comments or questions from Council, the issues were closed.

Agenda Item IX(f) – Parks & Outdoors (Evolving Our Riverfronts Parks)

Councilwoman Coonrod inquired about the funding provided to River City. Mr. Reuter presented the council with the process for the agreement with RiverCity Company. Mr. Noblett explained the funding and the contribution provided by the City of Chattanooga. Upon no further questions or comments, the issue was closed.

Councilman Hester adjourned the Parks & Public Works Committee at 3:54 p.m. and turned the business meeting over to Councilman Smith for Legislative Committee.

LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Councilman Smith, Committee Chair, called the Legislative Committee to order at 3:54 p.m., with a quorum of eight present. Vice Chair Hill was not in attendance of this meeting.

<u>MINUTE APPROVAL</u>: On motion of Councilman Ledford and second by Councilwoman Coonrod, the minutes of the last Committee meeting were approved as published.

Draft - Mass Violence Ordinance

Councilwoman Coonrod presented the <u>draft ordinance</u> and spoke on the impact of mass violence on community centers. She requested that Mr. Noblett incorporate language into the ordinance that would safeguard community center employees. [View the full discussion <u>here</u>.]

- Chair Henderson inquired about Section 25-40 and existing policy. Ms. Hunter addressed the council on the current internal policies in place.
- Councilman Ledford inquired about item D and the restitution costs. He suggested changing the language from "*schools*" to "*community centers*."
- Councilwoman Berz inquired about the detailed policy changes and considered more localized policies for greater flexibility.
- Councilwoman Noel inquired about the center managers' right to ban unruly individuals, to which Ms. Hunter responded.
- Councilman Hester asserted that the council must address the ordinance as a whole and make changes accordingly.
- Councilman Smith elaborated on the threats posed by mass violence and asked what safeguards are currently in place.

[Councilwoman Dotley exited the meeting during this committee.]

Upon no further questions or comments, Councilman Smith adjourned the committee at 4:20 p.m.
